## Topic

How to perform a host migration?

## Description

Migrating from current host to DreamHost used as example.

Note: - Will need a domain (\$13.95 to transfer .org)

- Registration, migration, and any add-ons will take time to build on the server side.
- Migration may cause some links to fail. You can edit these links in the admin dashboard.

## **Process**

- 1. Register Click Transfer Domain
- 2. Under **Web Hosting**, click **Edit**
- 3. A new page will open. Scroll to **Domain Name** 
  - a. There will be a button named Fully Manage Domain.
  - b. Click the button
- 4. Click One-Click Domain
  - a. Your database will automatically show up
  - b. Keep database automatic
- 5. Click Install Me Now! button
  - a. DreamHost will e-mail installer instructions
- 6. Wait for the site to build (approximately 10 minutes)
- 7. Install "All-in-One WP Migration" plugin to new WordPress host
  - a. Activate the plugin
- 8. Return to the site you wish to migrate to new host.
  - a. If you do not already have All-in-One Migration plugin installed install the plugin
  - b. Click **Export Export to File Download website** (A pop-up window will appear) click **Save File**
- 9. Return to your new site and go to All-in-One Wp Migration
  - a. Click Import Import from File
    - i. Note: Go to the folder where you saved your export file
  - b. Once the file is selected, click Open.

- i. A Warning pop-up window will appear. Click **Proceed.** A Success pop-up window will open.
- c. Follow Pop-up settings. Save twice.
  - i. A new window will open. Click **Upload Database**. Another Success popup window will appear. Click **Continue**
- 10. Log in to your newly hosted site with your Original WordPress login credentials
  - a. You are now logged in to your newly hosted site.
    - i. Make any small change to your site to enable the **Publish** button. Once it is enabled, click on the **Publish** button.
- 11. Your site is now viewable to the public.
